#### **MINUTES**

- 1. The meeting was convened at 12:47 p.m. via Zoom video conferencing by Jeff Scherer, Chairperson of the Facilities Committee. The meeting was held via Zoom video conferencing pursuant to the Executive Order issued on March 17, 2020 by Nebraska Governor, Pete Ricketts.
- 2. Recommended approval of the Minutes of the March 17, 2020 meeting as distributed.
- 3. Coleen Bressler introduced discussion regarding the Temporary Easement Agreement with Madison County, Nebraska. The purpose of the Easement is for completing the necessary grading and earthwork requirements for the Benjamin Avenue Paving Project. The Easement has been reviewed by legal counsel and language is included in the Easement which required Madison County to pay for any damage which may occur to utility lines, pipes, wires, fiberoptic or other cables, or any other utility for infrastructure improvement.

Following a brief discussion, a consensus was reached by the Facilities Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors to approve the Temporary Easement with Madison County, Nebraska, for the purpose of completing the necessary grading and earthwork requirements for the Benjamin Avenue Paving Project and authorize Dr. Leah A. Barrett, President of Northeast Community College, to execute all documents necessary to implement this action.
